A Word for The New Year


As we look ahead to 2026, we do so with gratitude for all that God has accomplished through our church in 2025. This past year was marked by faithful service, sacrifice, and perseverance, and your hard work has not gone unnoticed—by leadership or by the Lord. Scripture reminds us, “God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people” (Hebrews 6:10). As we start 2026 we are beginning a new program called Kingdom Kids, a service just for children during the regular worship service.





When computers seem to be tired, running slow, and less vibrant than normal, what do we do? We "reboot" them. We turn them off and back on. We unplug them and plug them back in. In essence, we "restart" them in hopes of better performance.



Inside a computer is a power supply and central processor. The power supply energizes the processor to run complex computations and return a result, visible on the monitor. The computer must have power, processing capability and a way to present the information.

Jesus said He is in the Father, the Father is in Him and He is in us. He is our power supply. His indwelling Spirit is our processor. Our daily walk is the display; the result of His presence in us!

At the end of each year we tend to look at January 1st as a "new start," a reboot. We do this in hopes of a fresh start, a renewed focus and rejuvenated energy. How do we reboot? Unplug from the world, for just a moment. Reconnect to His power (read, study, pray) and let His Spirit guide your every decision in 2026. Then the world will see visually the result of His presence in you and through you.

Patrick Strong has been helping out with the Student Ministry on Wednesday nights and shares his thoughts here:

I have been attending Mitch Buckelew's study on sexual purity, which he is presenting to the youth on Wednesday nights. When I was young, I can only say that the subject of sex was kind of taboo. I don't think I really knew what sex was till I was in high school. Now, sex is in everything and everywhere around us. Sex from a worldly perspective.



We must prepare our children when they encounter these temptations to resist evil from a Godly standpoint. More so, we must prepare ourselves to battle the constant temptations of this world.

God's perfect design for marriage is found in Genesis 2:18-25, "They were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed." This is the first time God describes marriage. Genesis 2:24, "Man shall leave his mother and father and shall cleave unto his wife, and they shall be one flesh." An intimate relationship inside the marriage partnership is how God designed sex. 1 Corinthians 6:18 reminds us to "Flee fornication, every sin a man doeth is without the body, but he that committeth fornication sinneth against his own body."

Mitch said it best when he reminded the youth to run from this sin. Literally run! Run! so that our lives, the lives of our children, the lives of our grandchildren will be pleasing to our God.
