A Word from Our Pastor

For Florida Baptists, November is the month that we hold our annual meeting. This year that meeting will be held in Orlando. If you are unfamiliar with how the Southern Baptist denomination (SBC) is structured let me give you a brief overview. The church is the top of our denomination which means that all Southern Baptist churches are independent. This means no one from the denomination tells us what to do, what to teach, who to hire, or what activities to hold. Instead the local church tells the denomination what to do. Our church also belongs to a small association of churches here in the northern part of our county. Additionally, we also belong to the Florida Baptist Convention which is comprised of all the SBC churches in our state. We support our denomination through a percentage of our undesignated offerings. When we collect that money, we first send it to the denominational headquarters in Florida (Jacksonville), and they keep about 50%. The other 50% is passed on to the national headquarters in Nashville where it is divided up between the various seminaries and mission organizations. What stays in Florida does the work of supporting theological education, church planting, the Florida Baptist Children's Home (One More Child), as well as the various state denominational workers who assist churches.

Our church decided many years ago to be a part of the SBC denomination and to cooperate with other SBC churches to do the work of the Gospel. This month at our annual meeting we will elect leaders and make decisions regarding the various issues facing our denomination. I will be attending the meeting this year and I plan on bringing a short report to the church after that meeting. Please be praying for our state denomination as we do the work the Lord has called us to do.

Mission Trip Update: Honduras 2025

To God be the Glory!! First, thank you Church for your prayers and support for Honduras 2025.

Special thanks to Kyle West for driving us to the airport, to Chuck Walthall for meeting and praying for our group at the airport, to Glenn Meyers for picking us up at the airport when we returned, and to Laura Kitchen and her staff for the many hours of work preparing our booklets and other areas of need.

Our goal was to be useful for the Kingdom, to teach, train, and equip the youth in the area of sexual purity and living (with God's help) with a pure heart.

During the mission trip, the team served a local village house church with Andrew bringing a gospel message. The team was able to pray

for the owner of the home who had health issues. In addition, 45 bags of rice and beans were provided for the village.



On day two we were able to visit the children's home and provide a blessing to the house moms with a personal gift. Ida Faye and Kelly did an awesome job with the younger children by sharing the story of David vs. Goliath - Andrew played the role of the big guy and Dale's role was the guy with strong faith and a good arm.

The youth conference began Friday afternoon with over 170 youth and leaders attending the event. The event included 4 teaching sessions, small group breakouts, and multiple games for the students to enjoy including soccer, ping pong, volleyball, and dodge ball.

A number of decisions were made by the students during the weekend including salvations, re-dedications,

and commitments to sexual purity and waiting until marriage.



Finally, the group attended a worship service on Sunday evening at the local church close to the Seminary. Andrew brought the message.
